Scope and content

Partial letter from the Australian Military Forces, Paddington, New South Wales, to George Crigan Graham Dungay, Murwillumbah, New South Wales. The letter relates to George Graham being nominated to participate in the Australian contingent of ex-servicemen at the coronation in London of King George VI in 1937. George Crigan Graham was the standard bearer for the Australian contingent at the 1937 coronation which took place on the 12th May 1937. Twenty-five men were chosen from New South Wales. The Australian contingent attended a number of official functions in England and Scotland, before attending final engagements in France.

George Graham gave a radio broadcast in July 1943 to advertise a Grand Diggers Sports Carnival in Murwillumbah to raise money for WWII prisoners of war; and in March 1946 assisted with the organisation of a 'Grand Victory Parade and Rodeo' held in Murwillumbah to welcome home local men and women who had served - the event raised £2000 for WWII prisoners of war and the Tweed District Hospital and Ambulance.
