Scope and content This collection contains 23 oral history interviews conducted by Dr Amanda Gearing with survivors and rescuers of the 2011 Lockyer Valley and Toowoomba floods. The interviews, recorded five years after the floods, examine the impact of the disaster on the lives of the interviewees. One interview was recorded in Spring Bluff, five in Murphys Creek, one in Toowoomba, two in Withcott, two in Postman's Ridge, five in Helidon, one in Carpendale and seven in Grantham.


