Administrative / Biographical history The Queensland Women's Electoral League was co-founded by Margaret Ogg and Christina Corrie (wife of Brisbane mayor Leslie Corrie) in 1903. Although one of its stated aims was "to advance political knowledge among women", and it was supposed to be non-partisan, it was in fact a liberal-conservative organisation, with funding provided by the Queensland National Defence League, guidance provided by two Liberal members of the Legislative Assembly, and another of its stated aims being "to encourage and preserve 'private enterprise' and to combat unnecessary interference by the state with the individual".

Money raised was used to assist women seeking election at local, state or federal level, and successful candidates were to repay the donation to benefit other women. Candidates assisted by this fund included Senator Annabelle Rankin, Senator Kathy Martin, Mrs Petronel White and Mrs Warner (the latter two ladies to Council).

Margaret Ogg was born in Brisbane in 1864, the daughter of Reverend Charles Ogg, a Presbyterian minister, and his wife Agnes McKellar. Growing up, Margaret constantly questioned the restrictions placed on women, but wasn't content with joining any of the existing suffrage organisations. Instead, she launched an outback tour, hiring halls in outback towns and visiting women in their homes to talk about the issues affecting them. Hecklers were hired by political parties opposed to the franchise being given to women, and when this form of intimidation failed to stop her, they banned her from hiring the halls. At this point Margaret purchased a horse and sulky, giving her a ready-made platform from which to address women, often outside the very halls from which she had been banned, and some kerosene lamps so she could speak at night when people had more time to listen. After finishing her tour of Queensland, Margaret returned to Brisbane and co-founded the Queensland Women's Electoral Union with Leslie Corrie, then mayor of Brisbane. She served as honorary secretary for more than 30 years, and in 1908 co-founded the Brisbane Women's Club. Margaret died in Brisbane in 1953.

Dame Ethel Mary Smith was born in England on April 23 1858. Musically gifted, she realised from a young age that she wanted to be a composer. She composed a variety of music, including chorals, instrumentals, chamber music, operas and orchestral music. After meeting Emmeline Pankhurst, the famous British suffragette, in 1910, Smyth decided to dedicate two years of her life to the suffragette movement, giving up music. However, it was during this period that she composed "March of the Women" which became the anthem for the suffragette movement around the world. In a famous incident, she conducted fellow suffragettes singing "March of the Women" in the exercise yard at Holloway Prison (where they were serving time for stoning the windows of those opposed to the movement) with her toothbrush from the window of her cell.
